PLUS = A little help after surgery

When Sue learned she needed to undergo a knee replacement, she realized how valuable her PLUS membership would become - because she would not be able to drive for a while. Being the independent and organized person that she is, she began to make preparations for the big day.

She found handyman volunteer services which helped her get some minor repairs done, to make navigating around the house easier. Arrangements were made with the garbage company to eliminate the need to have the cans pulled out to the street on pick up day. She even thought to get her car servicing taken care of with volunteer rides to and from Harloe's Car Repair.

Her sister was able to stay with her for a couple of weeks, but when she had to return home to Idaho, Sue was able to "check in" with a Village volunteer each morning for a couple of weeks, just to make sure she was up and all was well. Village volunteers made home visits, helped with simple household chores, provided local rides for appointments, picked up her mail, and even a few trips to Kaiser "over-the-hill". She also got help with shopping trips for groceries, a ride to get her taxes prepared, and was able to once again enjoy voice lessons at her church.

Sue also had the foresight to become enrolled in the Sam Trans Paratransit program for the Coastside – Redi-Coast. They picked her up and brought her for an assessment in Burlingame. While it took 3 weeks for the certification to be completed, she used their "little known" 5311 program, which provides for limited transportation without certification in our rural designated community.

Using available resources along with the generous donation of time from our service volunteers, Sue is very grateful to be able to stay in her home as she continues to heal. Indeed, it takes a Village!
